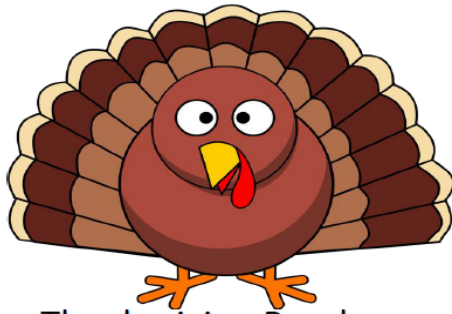
From the Nurse's Office:

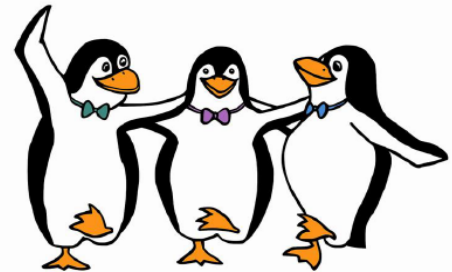

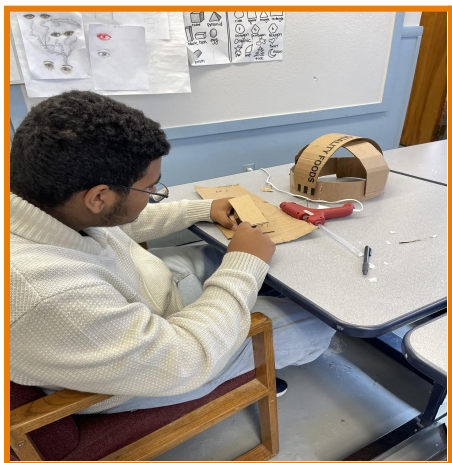

Around Gateway...

STEM: In STEM, students helped in creating some of the games for the fall festival. The tic tac toe board has been converted into a whiteboard for the classroom, and the ring toss table will be converted into a tilted flower pot stand next week.

Science: Today we did a lot with cooking on an outdoor fire, but it was applied to two different lessons. In earth science we learned about different modes of heat transfer, students felt heat radiating from the flames, the grill heated the hot dogs and pot through conduction, and the water boiled the hot dogs through convection. In algebra, students created a function to represent the fixed and variable costs of making s'mores, and at what point it would become hypothetically profitable to sell each s'more.

Geometry/Algebra I: In geometry, students measured volumes to create an iodine clock chemistry experiment. A quick explanation on reduction-oxidation reactions and the formation of triiodide-starch complex molecules was given.
